Happy Thanksgiving from PPA! PPA focuses on advocating for pharmacists in PA and advancing the profession. We are involved with many pharmacy topics such as policy making and advocacy, industry, community, and hospital. There is a place for everyone in PPA!

Our first event for the month of November was a Narcan Tabling Event held in the Salk Atrium. The event aimed to educate the Pitt Pharmacy community about substance use safety and harm reduction strategies. Participants learned how to properly use Narcan to prevent opioid overdoses and how to utilize xylazine and fentanyl test strips to identify dangerous substances. Attendees received free harm reduction kits that included Narcan, test strips, and valuable informational resources. On the same day, PPA also hosted an event focusing on collaborative

practice and state protocols in pharmacy. Students learned about how pharmacists are able to work with other healthcare professionals and expand their own responsibilities. On October 7th, we held another atrium event educating on point-of-care testing in PA. PPA hosted a vaccine practice speaker event where

student pharmacists were able to learn about a new policy passed in PA that expanded Pharmacists' ability to immunize pediatric patients as well as the unique intricacies of pediatric vaccinations. They also practiced their immunization skills using the Pitt Vaccination Hub's practice arms. We also hosted an ECAPS letterwriting campaign where participants were able to learn more about the ECAPS bill

and how to get involved with advocacy as a student pharmacist. Through the campaign, students were able to send a letter out to their legislators about the ECAPS bill. On November 19th, PPA hosted a fun OTC Family Feud Student vs Faculty event where 5 students and 5 faculty competed in an OTC Family Feud competition to assess their OTC medication knowledge.
